



Staffing


- **46 Sworn Officers**

- 2 Drug Agents, 1 Evidence Technician, 2 SRO's, 1 FBI Safe Streets TFO, 1 Court Officer




Civilian Staffing

CALLS FOR SERVICE 2024

- 27,749 calls for service
- 5,751 traffic stops (2,107 citations)
- 799 M/V crashes
- 1,200 offense reports
- 806 arrest reports
- 49 field identification reports




Mental Health Liaison

- 454 Mental Health Calls (Including suicide attempts/ threats)
- MHL responded to 282 calls for service
- MHL diverted 172 calls
- Over 40 group homes in Westbrook
- WPD responded to 151 calls for service to group homes
- 42 Overdoses and 4 fatalities.
