1. Welcome + Introductions (Group) BAC #5
2. Saccarappa Park Restoration Project
 - a. Presentation of Final Concept Design (Acorn)
 - i. Feedback received + incorporated from various charettes and meetings. Most recent changes include final structure renderings.
 - ii. Park focuses activities near Main Street with more intimate nature experience near the river, sewer line crosses the park and design accommodates setbacks. Garden focused in transitional spaces with grass in larger spaces for ease of maintenance.
 - iii. Design/Development effectively integrated with Dana St development.
 - iv. Group consensus on conceptual design as presented to BAC.
 - b. FAQs and Outreach to Charrette Participants
 - i. Robyn reviewed FAQ sheet – to be shared with final design on website and to charrette participants
 - ii. Barry Dodd questioned the amount of shade from the abutting structure, could the future include separate small leaves/structures in the park to tie it all together (future phases not out of the question, but limited by budget)
 - iii. Concluded to wait for council consensus on design prior to sending FAQ and social media posts
 - iv. Moved Council presentation up to 10/6 meeting
 - c. Final Design Scheduled to advance following PB approval for bidding this winter
3. Riverwalk North Update (Credere)
 - a. Current Concept – follows current utility corridor, several access points, two types of path (paved, boardwalk), currently invasive and natural resources need to be delineated with report anticipated in late October.
 - b. Neighborhood Meeting #1 (focus on abutters) and scheduled Meeting #2(focus on neighborhood)
 - i. Focus on what we heard from abutters in Meeting #1
 1. Privacy, safety, floodway, provide examples of similar paths
 2. Big picture – everyone wants to see the larger vision for the full downtown park/trail
 - ii. Meeting #2 to focus on positive active listening and some examples of how the concerns from Meeting #1 can be addressed.
 - iii. M. Shaughnessy brought up that the river is an impoundment and in 20 years the river could be lower if the dam were to be removed downstream.
 - iv. E. Simons asked about the plan for discussing contamination prevention/exposure prevention. Robyn agreed + hopes the plan will include added provisions for resiliency. Could consider an interagency meeting to ensure design considerations meet all competing interests (ACOE, IFW, DEP, etc.).
 - c. Pending Project Deliverables / Schedule presented for this 2-yr project
4. Riverwalk West Update (Credere)

- a. Project-related documents are in progress: ABCA / SSQAPP / VRAP
- b. DECD + GPCOG awarded Quaker Lane RLF Loan totaling \$1.5M for mixed-used redevelopment project
- c. The City's \$250K grant will focus on Mill Lane Rehab
- 5. New Brownfields Assessment Grant (Credere)
 - a. The new grant is in early stages (Site Inventory +Selection Process)
 - b. City plans to use funds for PFAS Investigation (3 city-owned fields)
- 6. Schedule + Next Steps (Group)
 - a. Rip shared info on Landbank Lightning Grants \$25k for eliminating blight
 - b. Robyn shared positive feedback from attending the National 2025 Brownfields Conference and the \$25k award for services from Kansas TAB. Expert on indigenous communication.
 - c. Goal for Brownfields over the winter – Vision for brownfields program.
